Strong majorities of voters believe a shutdown should be avoided because it:

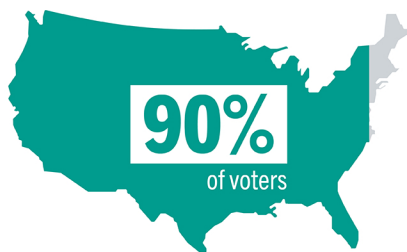


Harms the economy

90% of voters agree lawmakers should work together to avoid a government shutdown and focus on finding solutions for our national debt.



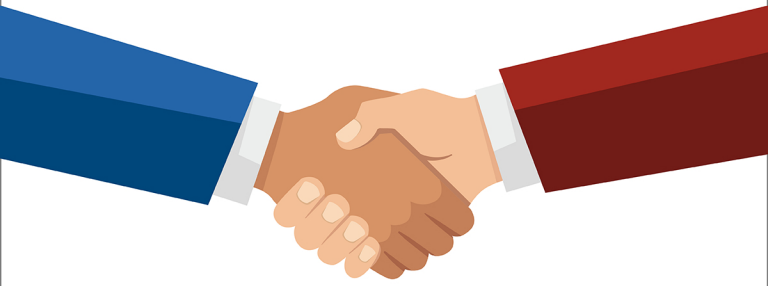
