As you may know, the national debt recently surpassed \$35 trillion for the first time and is projected to reach \$36 trillion by Election Day. Interest on the debt averages \$2.4 billion per day, or \$7,000 for every American household this year.

In fact, the national debt is on pace to reach \$57 trillion in just 10 years. We already spend more on interest on the national debt than we do on Medicare, national defense, infrastructure, education, climate, children or public health. In order to stabilize the debt, leaders will have to find savings in the budget by raising revenue or cutting spending - or some combination of both.
